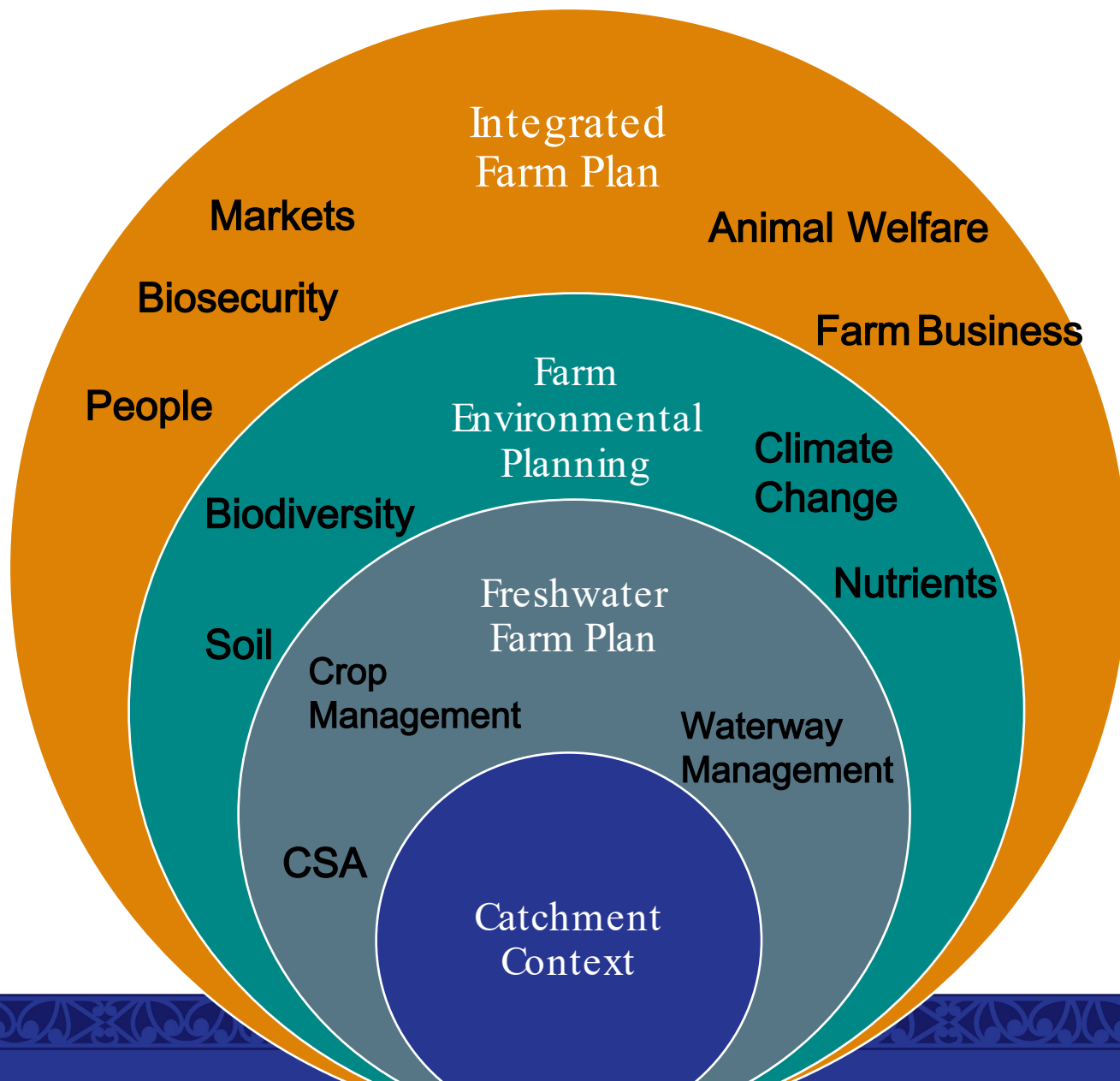




Fresh Water Farm Plans



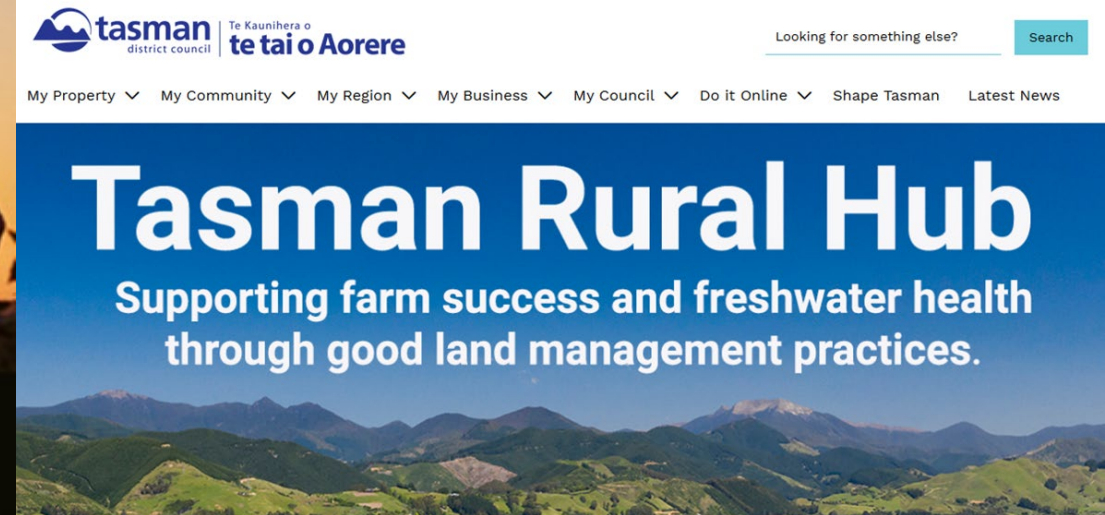
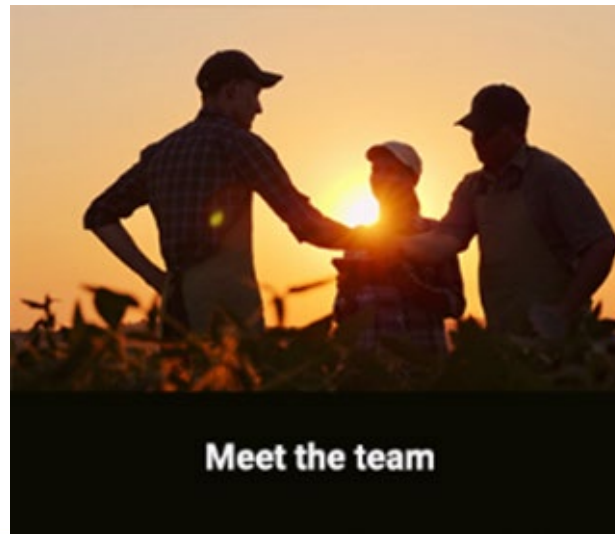
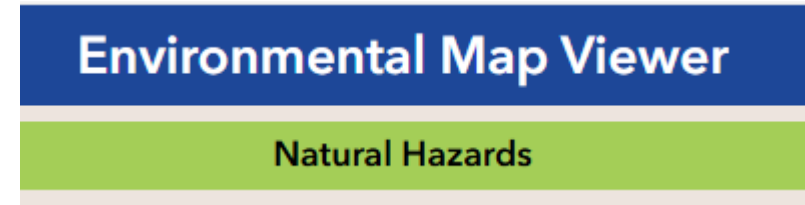
Freshwater Farm Plans (FWFPs) are a specific type of farm plan - a module or subset of a Farm Environment Plan (FEP)

Inherent vulnerabilities specific to your catchment
– geology, soil type, slope etc

Some Government changes:

Freshwater Farm Plans Regs:

- Not going away, just on pause and will likely have some tweaks at the certification/audit end of the process.

Land and Freshwater Plan Changes:

- Ability to notify is on pause, however for TDC this is still being progressed internally

RM (Freshwater & Other Matters) Act

- Intensive winter grazing (repeal consenting; new 5m setback & CSA standard)
- Stock Exclusion regulations (repeal of low slope map and associated requirements)
